## HPB Meeting Minutes

Heritage Preservation Board Meeting Minutes of March 5, 2025

12:00am-1:00 (rescheduled) pm, Wayzata City Hall Conference Room

### **1. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 12:02 p.m.

### **2. Roll Call**

Board Chair Sonya Travanty and Board members Kelly Gratton, Judy Starkey and Sue Ankeny present. City staff included the Community Development Director, Alex Sharpe and Planner, Haily Hedblom.

### **3. Approval of Minutes**

Chair Travanty made a motion to approve minutes, second by Board Member Ankeny. Board member Gratton noted a corrective item in the minutes changing her last name to Board Member Gharrity. With the amendment the minutes were approved unanimously.

### **4. Old Business**

#### **a. Review 2025 Mayor's Award and Centennial Home Awards**

Chair Travanty provided an introduction to the presentation for the Mayor's award noted the attendance of the recipient and Board members.

Board member Starkey questioned why did more people not attend and noted disappointment. She also discussed how the graphics were prepared. Director Sharpe noted that this discussion also applied to the Centennial awards and that staff prepared the graphics of each home with help from Chair Travanty and Board member Gharrity. Chair Travanty used Chat GPT to prepare a draft of the Mayor's Award. Staff then took this draft and utilized the technique for all of the Centennial homes. Board member Gharrity took photos of homes that the City did not already have to ensure the most accurate representation was made.

Discussion occurred on how the rest of the Centennial Awards could be delivered. Board members offered to deliver several if staff prepared a letter describing the award and background. Staff will deliver any remaining awards after Board members have volunteered. Discussion occurred on particular homes and the character being preserved.

#### **b. Review 2025 Work Plan**

Workplan – James J Hill Day participation. The Board noted past participation at James J Hill Day and the lackluster public interaction. Some members noted that they felt

participation was essential to the HPB and the future workplan. Others noted a concern for their limited budget and high cost of participation combined with a distinct lack of Wayzata focus to the event.

The Board discussed participation in other local events that have a Wayzata focus and a historical tie.

The board suggested that if participation in James J Hill day would no longer be a priority, staff should research and provide additional context on how the HPB could partner with the Minnetonka historical society or conservancy partnership for future participation.

Other Board members noted that a Art Fair partnership with a specific artist to create new art and advertise HBP

Future participation in thePancake breakfast at 4<sup>th</sup> of July – daughters of the American Revolution could be explored.

Chair Travanty Motioned to eliminate participation in James J Hill days as an action item on the work plan for the HPB.

Motion carried with 3 ayes: Travanty, Ankeny, Gratton. One in dissent: Starkey

Motion by Chair Travanty to add agenda item to seek a future event that aligns with same vote second by Ankeny.

The Board asked that staff research the HPB budget \$3,500 vs. \$1,000 budget item and provide the Board with all background. Staff was able to bring the HPB budget up for 2026, 2025, 2024 and 2023 and confirmed that in 2024 the HPB budget increased from \$1,000 to #3,500.

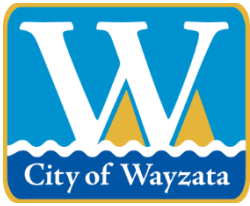

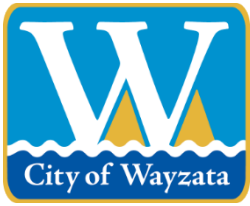

### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Review an inventory of existing City Historical Plaques provided by Vice Chair Judy Starkey and determine a prioritization plan for replacement.

There will be budget considerations for the design and physical replacement of the plaques. Costs will need to be researched and proposed to the Board prior to work beginning.

### **2024-2026 STRATEGIC PLAN PRIORITIES RELEVANCE:**

### **BACKGROUND:**

The ongoing discussion of Wayzata's plaques began in 2023, when language on the First Cemetery Plaque (located at the corner of Walker Avenue and Wayzata Boulevard) was raised for consideration. The discussion was put on hold for most of 2024 as other issues took priority. The Board's work plan called for the discussion to begin again in 2025.

The topic was resumed during the January 23, 2025, meeting where the Board reviewed an inventory of existing plaques within the city (public and private). The HPB had some records of the plaques it had produced in the past; however, the record was not comprehensive. A draft of the current inventory was presented at this meeting.

Discussion surrounding the plaques will resume again during the July 24, 2025, meeting where the HPB will further review the inventory of plaques and determine a plan for prioritizing which plaques should be updated in what order. Further conversation may occur, such as considering locations for new public plaques and creating criteria by which those locations could be prioritized for future implementation.

To provide context for new staff, and remind the Board, staff will present the materials shared with the Commission. Additionally, staff is proposing to create a Plaque specific work plan. The proposed work plan below is a draft intended to provide context.

1. .Inventory and photo collection
  1. An incomplete inventory and map have been discussed previously. Board members have noted that a more comprehensive inventory exists. Staff would like to work with the board to complete a full inventory.
  2. .Categorization of Plaques
    1. Plaques will be of 3+ types: Within a park or trail, Within the Conservancy purview, or general City Plaques.
  2. Create work plan/timeline for each Plaque type.
  3. Design Plaques (where applicable).
  4. Installation timeline/priority.

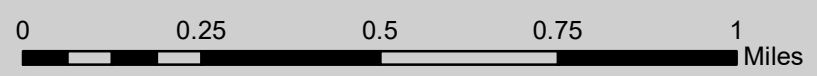
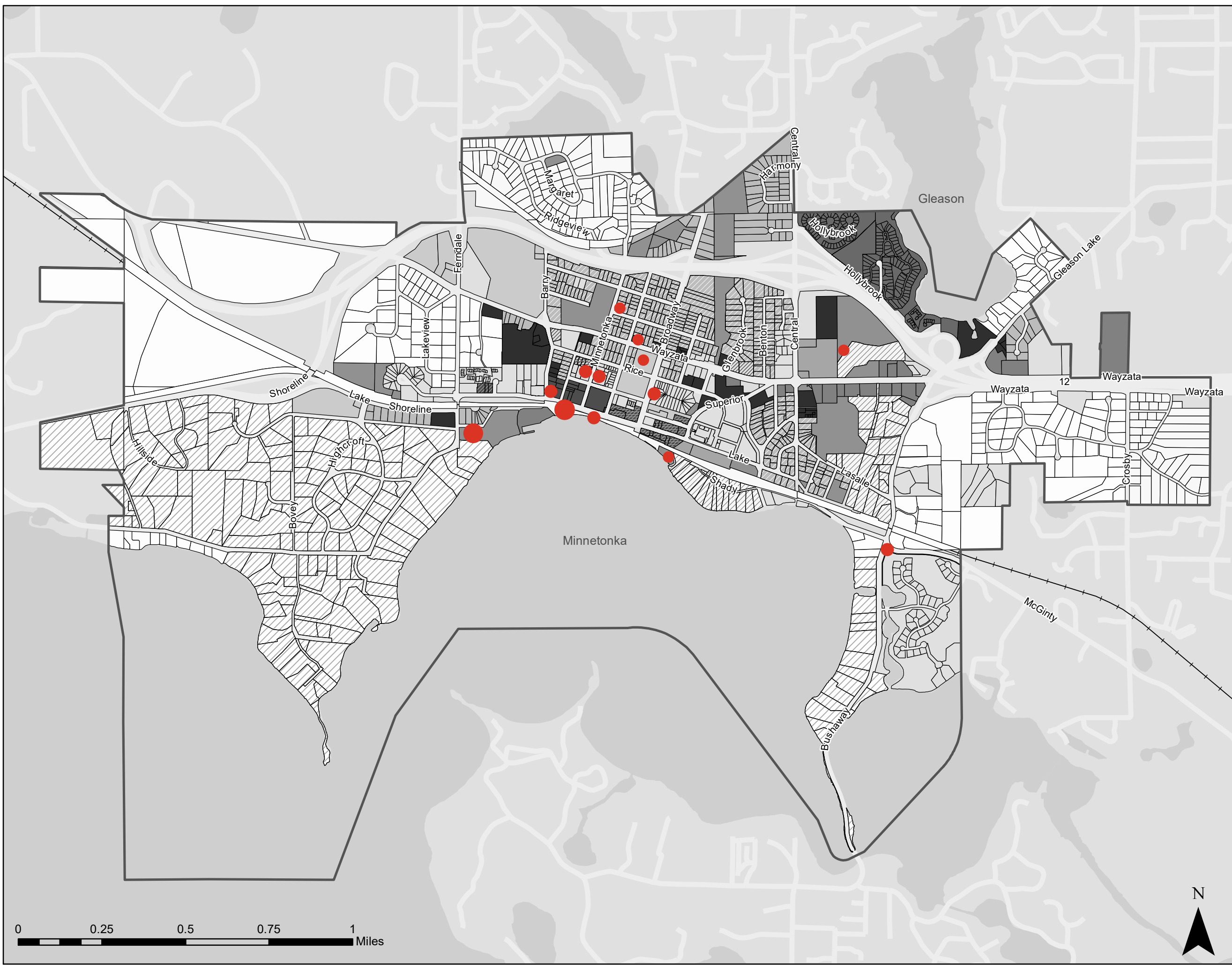

## Native American Burial Grounds on Wayzata's Public Square

Three burial mounds were located here well before the arrival of Euro-American settlements. The first mound, nearest the corner of Walker and Indian Mound Streets, was a large circular mound 50 feet in diameter and 3.5 feet high. It overlooked Lake Minnetonka, a spiritual place for native peoples.

The second mound, just a short distance to the east, situated parallel to Indian Mound Street, was 70 feet long, 22 feet wide and 1.5 feet high. The third mound, several feet to the north of the second mound and well into the square, was also round and about one half the size of the larger round mound. Two of the mounds were excavated by Dr. Demontreville of the Minnesota Historical Society in 1867.

Euro-Americans desecrated many of the mounds around Lake Minnetonka and removed the contents, including human remains. Today, this practice is not accepted. Mounds are cemeteries protected under state law and remain spiritual places.

According to Native Americans and archaeologists, mound building began in Minnesota by 500 B.C. and lasted until at least 1500 A.D. Mounds around Lake Minnetonka were built by the ancestors of the Dakota people.

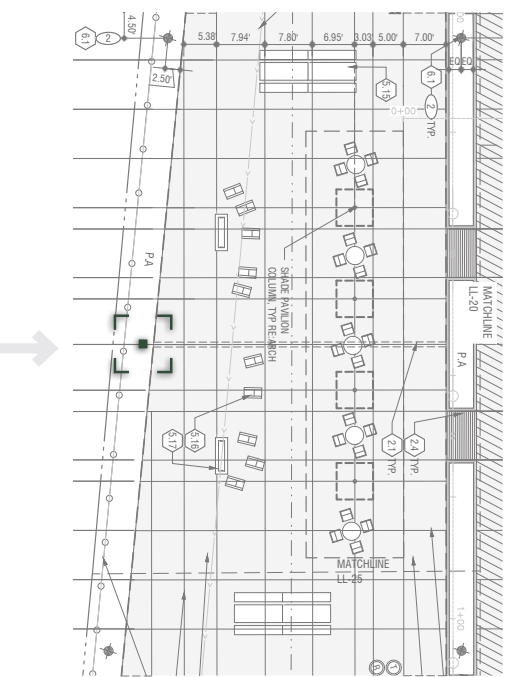

Existing Sign

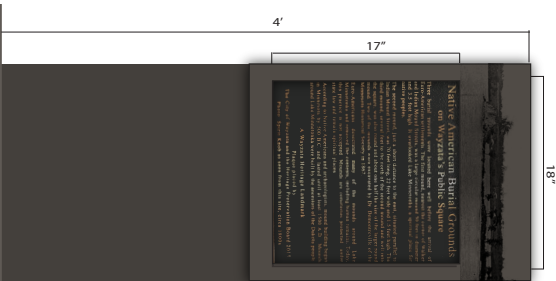

The concept incorporates a historic image of Spirit Knob, which is visible from the sign location. Concept A incorporates an existing sign, and Concept B creates a new sign that fully embraces the Panoway signage concept.



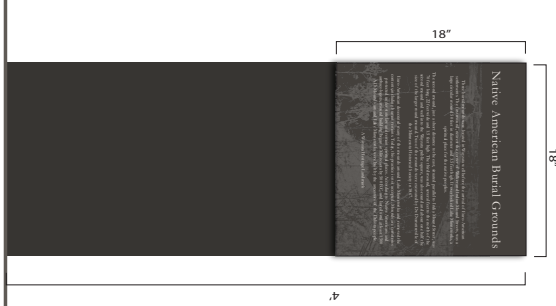
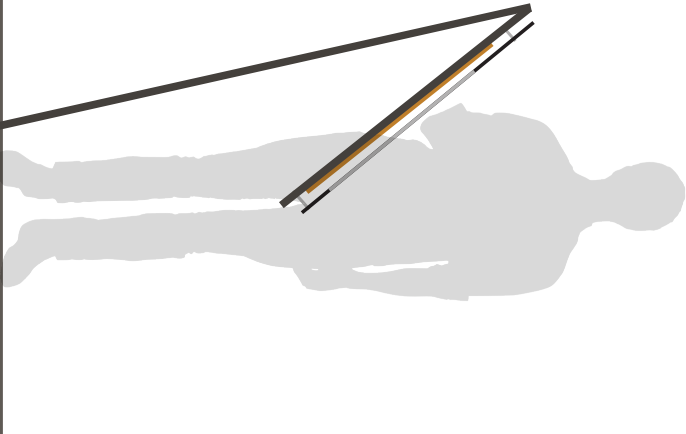

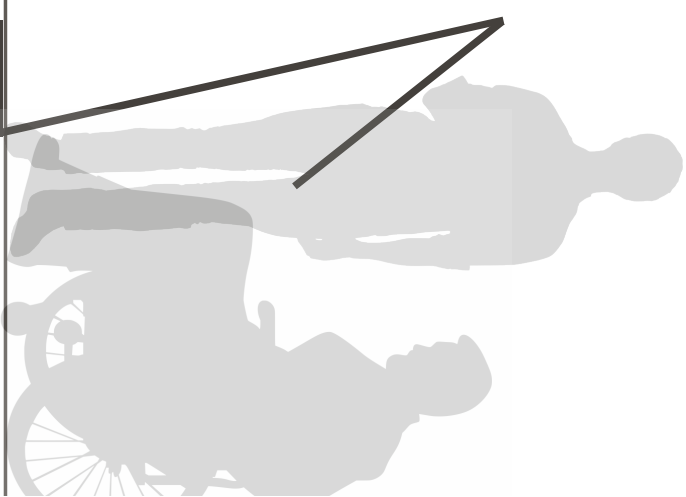

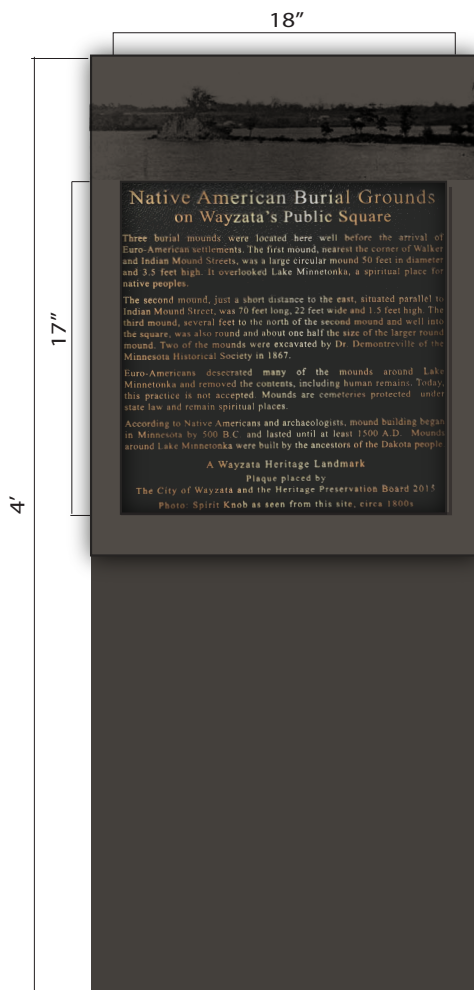


EXHIBIT A: Elevation

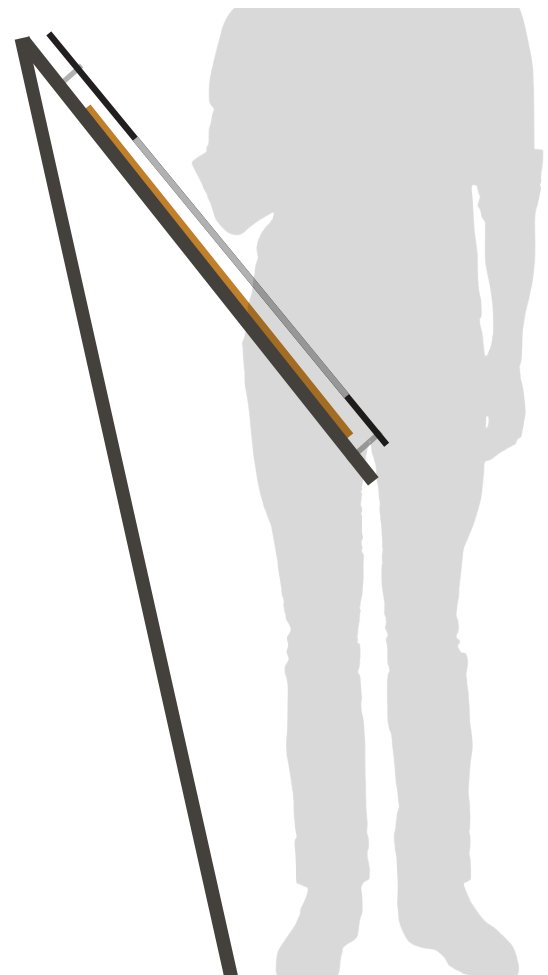

**BACKGROUND:**

**History of the Wayzata Towne Trolley**

The original Wayzata Towne Trolley was owned by the Wayzata Community Foundation and operated by the Greater Wayzata Area Chamber of Commerce. The Towne Trolley was a longstanding community amenity, operating in its original form from 1989 to 2011. The trolley route included 17 stops identified by official 'Trolley Stop' signs throughout the city. Popular stops included the Wayzata Depot, Wayzata Library, Wayzata Beach, and the shopping center at Colonial Square. The full tour loop lasted approximately 30 minutes in length. The Towne Trolley service ran on a varied schedule throughout its tenure. Hours of operation changed depending on the day and month. Service was typically only offered in the summer months. Riding the trolley was a free service to residents and visitors.

The original Wayzata Towne Trolley service was sponsored by the Greater Wayzata Area Chamber of Commerce and funded by local business advertisements. Advertisements would be posted on the exterior body of the trolley car as well as posted inside the rider area. Community donations were also accepted inside the trolley.

As the trolley car aged, maintenance requirements and costs became of greater concern. Several fundraising events were held throughout the later years of operation. Despite community efforts, it was determined that the 2011 season would be the last. The Chamber sold the trolley car after operations ceased.

**History-Related Events on the Wayzata Towne Trolley**

In the mid 2000s, a historic landmark tour was offered on the Towne Trolley. The 'Gold Coast Tour' was offered on Wednesday afternoons June-August, departing from the Wayzata Depot and traveling west along Ferndale Road to Minnetonka Beach. Historical information about landmarks and areas along the route was shared with riders. This tour was coordinated by the Chamber and cost \$7 for adults and \$3 for children 12 and under.

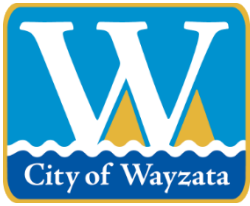
**Attempted Revival of Trolley Service in Wayzata**

Trolley car service returned to Wayzata briefly for two seasons in 2016-17. This service was named the Lake Minnetonka Trolley and ran a one-hour loop on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am-6pm June through

August. This trolley also operated a limited service on Wednesday evenings in July related to the Music By The Lake concerts held those years. This service was upheld by a local nonprofit called Lake360 Inc. which formed in response to the original trolley service in Wayzata ceasing operations. A group of local residents band together to raise funds to re-establish trolley service in the city. Lake360 Inc. worked with the City of Wayzata and contracted with Renee's Royal Valet limousine company to operate services. The Lake360 board was comprised of volunteers, so the only overhead cost they had was to rent the trolley through Renee's, who carried the insurance, paid the drivers and handled maintenance on the vehicle. Ultimately, the efforts of Lake360 were not sustained and the trolley service ended after two seasons.

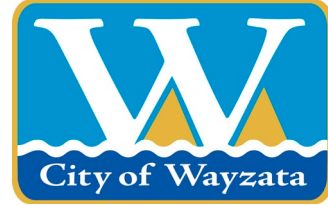
