### **Call to Order**

The meeting began at 11:50 a.m.

### **Roll Call**

Board members Sonya Travanty, Judy Starkey, Kim Gharrity, and Sue Ankeny were present. Staff present was Community Development Director, Alex Sharpe.

### **Approval of Minutes**

Chair Sonja motioned to approve the minutes of July 24, 2025 and the unofficial meeting minutes of August 28, 2025. Board member Gharrity seconded the motion . Approved 4-0.

### **Old Business:**

#### **Review 2025 Work Plan Updates**

Staff presented the current work plan and the status for the remainder of the year. Several items on the agenda are new work items for the Board that have additional details to follow. One of the primary items for the Board to consider in the coming months is attraction and retention of members. The Board will have three terms expire on 12/31/2025 and another member has expressed their intent to step down. The Board encouraged the City to post openings in the Muni and via social media. Staff will work with the City Clerk to ensure advertisement of the positions is available.

#### **History of Trolley Service in Wayzata**

Staff presented the current bids for an hourly trolley service to the Board. The Board discussed having a Trolley event in 2025, potentially tied to a Holiday theme. The Board was tasked with determining a route, date, and outreach to other parties to determine whether they would have interest in partnership with the Board to host the event. The Board will bring this work back at the next meeting to present.

#### **Replacement of City Plaques**

The Board discussed replacement of a single plaque, the First Cemetery to enlarge the plaque and remove questionable text but otherwise maintain its charm. Staff was directed to obtain an additional quote from Franklin Bronze for a single plaque and to work with the Public Works Department to determine how the Plaque could be installed on the fence.

## DRAFT HPB Meeting 9-25-25 Meeting Minutes

Motion by Board member Starkey and seconded by member Gharrity to direct staff to begin the process.

### **New Business:**

#### **Request for Local Designation as Heritage Preservation Site – Blue Water Theatre Company**

Director Sharpe presented that the City Council had approved the authorization for the City to assist with Blue Water Theater’s designation to the National Register of Historic Places. He also noted that the application and designation to the National Register would be the easiest and most expedited path for Blue Water to take with the local designation.

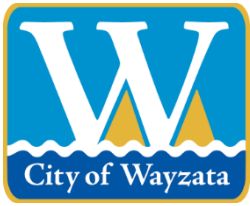

The HPB specifically would provide historical knowledge, direction to historic resources, and review of any historic documentation for Blue Water. The board also provided Blue Water with significant background research conducted by Board member Starkey.

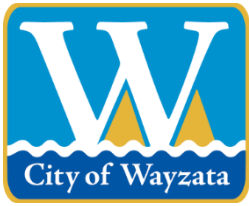

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Dear Wayzata Community Supporter:

I am reaching out on behalf of our Blue Water Theatre Company Board of Directors to share an important update. As you may know, the historic Blue Water Theatre building in downtown Wayzata suffered storm damage over the summer. The Board of Directors had been in contact with City officials and local historic society staff about the possibility of pursuing a historical designation to help preserve our building. We appreciate the support and feedback we have received.

While this designation may have offered some long-term benefits, we ultimately determined that we do not currently have the financial stability to take on such a complex process—especially when the grant funding associated with it was not guaranteed and would potentially not arrive until years in the future.

In light of the current financial situation facing Blue Water, the Board of Directors is reaching out with an urgent request for your help. We need to raise **\$500,000 by the end of this year** in order to maintain our historic home. These funds will allow us to help make critical improvements to the building, pay down existing loans, and invest in a sustainable future for the building and our organization. Without this support, the Board may have no other choice than to begin the process of selling the building on **January 1, 2026**.

We would ask you to please forward this information regarding Blue Water's urgent need with your constituents, other historical societies, companies or corporations interested in charitable giving, and any other people that you may know who want to see this building preserved for future generations in Wayzata to enjoy.

Over the last year, our leadership team has worked tirelessly to make responsible and forward-thinking changes. Together, we have streamlined operations, reduced expenses, and invested strategically in grant writing. We have also begun adjusting tuition and ticket pricing to more closely align with market rates. These steps are essential to our sustainability, but their financial impact will take at least a year or more to fully materialize.

The non-budgeted expenses related to the recent storm damage have significantly strained our resources. We also continue to feel the weight of debt accumulated during the pandemic. Compounding this challenge, we are navigating an economic landscape where even our most loyal donors are having to stretch their giving further than ever before.

We deeply want to preserve our historic home as it is an integral part of our community and important to the children that we serve. We are calling on our community to stand with us in this defining moment. Together, we can ensure that Blue Water continues to be a place where young people discover not only the stage, but also themselves.
